



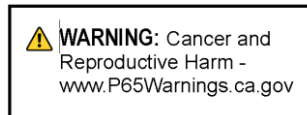
## California Proposition 65 Corporate Statement

May 16, 2018

To Whom It May Concern:

California Proposition 65, also known as the safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, was enacted as a California ballot initiative in November 1986. The Proposition was intended by its authors to protect California citizens and the State's drinking water sources from chemicals determined by a state agency to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. Approximately 900 chemicals are now on California's Proposition 65 list. In May 2013, California Gov. Edmund G. Brown Jr. proposed reforms to strengthen California Proposition 65. The Governor called for changes requiring more useful information to the public on what they are being exposed to and how they can protect themselves.

The New OEHHA regulations, adopted in August 2016 and that will take full effect in August 2018, change the safe harbor warnings which are deemed to comply with the law in several important ways. For this reason, Sunscope will be adding the short form warning that will read as follows:



Sunscope is committed to applying the highest standards of safety for its products. We continually work with our distributors and supply chain partners to implement a process that ensures the purchase and use of our products will meet California Proposition 65 standards. Our primary concern during this transition to the new regulation is to clarify that Sunscope as a California based company and a manufacturer has the primary responsibility to provide California Proposition 65 warnings.
